
The Queen's Hat by Steve Antony

Toys and Games of the Past

Non-Fiction Unit: Report

Linking to the children's previous learning in History about toys of the past, this unit will get the children writing about how toys work, what they are made of and how they can be played with. Using simple report features such as titles, subheadings and diagrams will help construct their reports to be informative and interesting to

Skills: Some use of capital letters and full stops, Phonetically plausible spelling, Use of 'and' and 'but', and some use of common exception words.

Spelling Focus: Phonetic pocus depending on book level— see reading diaries and book bag books.

Number Bonds:

Construct, draw and write number bonds to 10

Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero

Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction

(-) and equals (=) signs

Recap number bonds, missing number calculations, problem solving with number bonds

Use these number bonds to apply to number bonds to 20. E.g. $I_f\ I$ know 6 + I = I7,

then I know 16 + 1 = 17 and 6 + 11 = 17.

Problem Solving:

Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as 7 = -9.

Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher
