


**Fiction Unit:** Traditional Tale

A classic story that all know and will help the children start to write their own traditional tale.

**Fiction Unit:** Traditional Tale

A much-loved family favourite. The old wood-carver Geppetto decides to make a wonderful puppet which can dance and turn somersaults, but by chance he chooses an unusual piece of wood - and the finished puppet can talk and misbehave like the liveliest child. But Pinocchio is brave and inquisitive as well as naughty. Another adventurous tale to inspire the children.


**Skills:** Some use of capital letters and full stops. Phonetically plausible spelling. Use of 'and' and 'but', and some use of common exception words.

**Spelling Focus:** Phonetic focus depending on book level— see reading diaries and book bag books.

# Maths


## Place Value:

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of twos, fives and tens
- Given a number, identify one more and one less
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least. AND: Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.



## Number Bonds:

- Learn number bonds for each number up to 10 using the number bond songs
- Construct, draw and write number bonds to 10 (starting with learning the bonds through song)
- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs



# Art

**Drawing:** Make your Mark  
This unit helps pupils to understand and use different lines and techniques; enhancing children's ability to describe lines, control drawing materials like pencils and chalk, and experiment.



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# Computing

**Improving mouse skills**  
Developing mouse skills by learning how to log in and navigate around a computer while creating digital artwork.



# D.T.

**Structures:**  
Constructing a Windmill  
Children will create a stable structure using tools and equipment accurately to make a windmill. They will plan, join and create their structure.

## Let the Children Come:
