

Anticipate key events in a story. Retell a familiar story with some exact repetition of language but also use some of their own words.


Writing:

We shall use these books to explore and apply these skills.







Learning to Read and Write:			
As a School we use Read Write Inc. as a programme of study for the teaching of early reading and writing. Freed Write Inc. as a programme of study for the teaching of early reading and writing. This half term we shall introduce your children to Fred the Frog and lots of the tools to help children learn to read and write. Your child will learn to read in a very simple way: Read letters by their 'sounds' Blend these sounds into words Read the words in a story. More information will be shared with you soon about supporting your child with reading and writing. Keep watch for presentations, booklets and workshops in the future. However, if you are eager to learn more, check out the following website: https://www.ruthmiskin.com/parents/	First, your child will learn to read: Set I Speed Sounds (in this order): These are sounds written with one letter: masdtinpgock ubfelhrjv ywzx Watch the 'How to Say Sounds' video online. Once your child knows at least the first 5 sounds, they will learn words containing these sounds, by sound-blending: m-a-t mat, c-a-t cat, g-o-t got, f-i-sh fish, s-p-o-t spot, b-e-s-t best.	Later your child will learn sounds written with two letters: Your child will call these 'special friends' sh th ch qu ng nk ck As soon as your child can orally blend, they will start to read appropriate books: Blending Books and Red, Green and Purple Storybooks.
